Program Goals

Critical pediatric patients that must be transported between facilities require a different level of care from hospital or out of hospital patients. PNCCT^(SM) is designed to prepare paramedics and nurses to function as members of a Pediatric and Neonatal Critical Care transport team. Participants will gain an understanding of the unique anatomy, physiology, pathophysiology and special needs of critical pediatric and neonatal patients during inter-facility transport. This course integrates lectures and skill stations to help the participants become familiar with the purpose and mechanisms of hospital procedures, equipment, and skills to maintain the stability of hospital equipment and procedures during transport.

A variety of lectures will cover commonly seen pediatric and neonate illness and injuries requiring interfacility transport related to respiratory, cardiovascular, trauma, neurological, heme/immunology, renal, and gastrointestinal considerations.

Curriculum Design

The Pediatric and Neonatal Critical Care Transport Program is designed to provide the educational foundation required for specialists transporting critical care pediatric/neonatal patients. In addition, it may serve as a springboard for those institutions looking to expand into Pediatric and Neonatal Critical Care Transport.

This continuing education activity is approved by UMBC, an organization accredited by the Continuing Education Coordinating Board for Emergency Medical Services (CECBEMS).

Registration and Refunds
