

**E-Mail**-All ENMU students are provided with e-mail accounts. Activate e-mail accounts by following the directions at <https://itsweb.enmu.edu/usermgt/index.php>  
**The student's ENMU e-mail account will be the only address used for faculty and official communication.**

## Accessing and Using Online Course Accounts-

Online classes and supplemental materials are delivered through WebCT, a course management program and virtual learning environment. Students can access their WebCT accounts from any computer connected to the Internet.

To log in to WebCT courses, students can either go to the ENMU-Portales Web page (<http://www.enmu.edu>) and click on the Current Students links on the left side of the page or go directly to the login page at [online.enmu.edu](http://online.enmu.edu).

To log in to courses a student will need to use his/her **Student ID number** as the Username: for example 930000000. If a student forgets or doesn't know his/her Student ID number he/she can call the Office of the Registrar at 575-562-2175 or 800-FOR-ENMU (select Option 3).

**A student's birthdate will be the default password.** For example, if a student's birthdate is Dec. 2, 1982, the password will be 120282.

## Attention: Students Taking Courses Off-Campus

To serve you better, ENMU offers a variety of services to students who attend ENMU classes at off-campus sites. These classes include videoconference, on-site and online classes and weekend workshops.

**Registration** Early online registration is encouraged as distance courses fill quickly. Payment is required by the last day to pay published in the class schedule each semester. For information about the installment payment plan, contact the Office of Student Accounts prior to registering at 800-537-5376, ext. 2615. **Note:** Students taking online courses should register before the first day of classes to avoid delays in receiving class material from the instructor.

**Books** All arrangements for books may be made with the ENMU Barnes & Noble Campus Bookstore in Portales. Books for Distance Education classes may be purchased online at [www.bncollege.com](http://www.bncollege.com) or via telephone by calling 877-499-2665 or 575-562-2718. Shipping charges are \$6.95 for one item and \$1.95 for each additional item. Expedited rates will apply for next day or second day shipments. Books prices may be accessed via the website. Textbooks will be bought back at the end of each semester. Buyback pricing is subject to instructor demand and stock availability.

**ID Cards** An ID card is required of students if they are awarded financial aid, wish to enter the ENMU Campus Bookstore the first two weeks of class, or use selected services of Golden Library. ID cards can be obtained from the Office of the Silver Pass located in SAS 107, Monday-Friday between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. The cost for a new ID is \$25.

**Library** Full library services are available to all off-campus students online. The library provides assistance online, by phone, e-mail and chat. A guide explaining these services is available from the library, Distance Education or your class facilitator. Questions may be directed to Golden Library by calling 800-450-7279 or 575-562-2624.
