

Graduates Celebrate Spring Commencement

ore than 200 ENMU-Roswell and Adult Education graduates celebrated with friends and family during commencement ceremonies held May 11 and 12. About 70 students participated in the Twenty-Seventh Annual GED®/HiSET® Adult Education Graduation Ceremony, which was held in the Performing Arts Center on campus. Chaves County Treasurer, Charlotte Andrade was the featured speaker. The student speaker, Jennifer Larez, said the Adult Education program set her on a path to becoming a nurse. "Be exactly who you want to be," she said. "Never give up. Get out of your comfort zones because you are all worth it."

The 67th Commencement Convocation was split into two ceremonies at the Roswell Convention and Civic Center to accommodate the large crowds. A total of 474 certificates and associate degrees have been approved for this spring. A group of 93 New Mexico Youth ChalleNGe graduation candidates also received Certificates of Employability.

Honors graduate and Presidential Scholar, Sonia Sanchez, gave the commencement address. She focused her remarks on the "yes's" that made it pos-

Local High School Grads Urged To Apply For GEAR UP Scholarship



Public high school students in Chaves County who graduate in 2017 or 2018 are encouraged to take advantage of the GEAR UP (Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs) scholarship to help pay for their college education. GEAR UP Scholarships are available to 2017 and 2018 graduates of Dexter High School, Goddard High School, Hagerman High School, Lake Arthur High School, Roswell High School and Early College High School in Roswell.

The scholarship can be used to attend ENMU-Roswell or any accredited degree granting institution in the U.S. To obtain the scholarship award, graduates must complete and submit the GEAR UP Scholarship application and provide official high school transcripts or GED (HiSET) certificate; verification of U.S. citizenship eligibility requirements; and verification of enrollment in an accredited degree-granting institution of higher education (billing statement). Priority sta-

tus will be given to students who submit their information by July 1.

ENMU-Roswell officials say this is a unique opportunity for local high school graduates. Students should contact their GEAR UP high school Academic Advisor for the GEAR UP Scholarship application. Information and the application is also under the Financial Aid section of the ENMU-Roswell web site at www.roswell. enmu.edu. Call the Financial Aid office at 575-624-7153 for more information about the GEAR UP scholarship. GEAR UP is federally funded by the United States Department of Education and sponsored by ENMU-Roswell.

First Early College High School Graduate Enjoying NM Tech

Liver since he began taking college algebra classes at 11 years old, Tanner Thornton has been on a fast track to a bachelor's degree. At 15, Thornton was the first graduate of Roswell's Early College High School (ECHS). While at ECHS, he completed 18-20 college credits each semester and graduated from the four-year early college program in just two years. "It was challenging and a lot of work keeping track of both high school and college classes," he said. Thornton said his favorite college class was Calculus II.

In May of 2016, Thornton received an Associate of Applied Science degree in Mathematics from ENMU-Roswell while on the Presidential Scholarship. He then enrolled at New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology (also known as NM Tech) in Socorro and is currently pursuing a bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering. Thornton took 17 hours on campus this spring semester. Now 16 years old, he is making new friends and is enjoying his classes, which he describes as "more challenging than in high school." His favorite class now is Ordinary Differential Equations.

Through ECHS and ENMU-Roswell, Thornton feels he was prepared well for this next stage in his college education. "But you can't be prepared for everything, like being on your own for the first time," he said. With most of his general education courses completed, Thornton said he is focusing now on central science classes to complete his bachelor's degree. He then plans to pursue a master's degree in Mechatronics Technology that combines mechanical engineering and electrical engineering.

Tanner may return to Roswell for the summer or enroll in a few summer courses at NM Tech. He is also applying for other educational opportunities and plans to do some independent projects to prepare for courses in the fall.


