the Summer Food Service Program for Children (SFSP). Meals will be provided to all eligible children free of charge. (To be eligible to receive free meals at a residential or non residential camp, children must meet the income guidelines for reduced-price meals in the National School Lunch Program.) Foster children and children who are part of households that receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly food stamps) benefits, or benefits under the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) are automatically eligible to receive free meals at eligible program sites.

Acceptance and participation requirements for the Program and all activities are the same for all regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability, and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service.
