Campus Food Pantry Open to Serve Students

NMU-Roswell's new campus Food Pantry, Cosmo's Cupboard, is now open Mondays and Wednesdays from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. and on Fridays from 8 a.m. to noon. The pantry is located in room 121 of the Instructional Center, 58A University Blvd. The food pantry stocks a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables, in addition to canned and packaged food items for ENMU-Roswell students. ENMU-Roswell discovered

through a Real College survey conducted in the fall of 2020 that 39 percent of ENMU-Roswell students had experienced food insecurity in the prior 30 days. "This pantry will provide healthy food choices and meet a critical need for our students who will enjoy the convenience of obtaining food on campus," said James Woody, Food Pantry Coordinator. The pantry is being funded by an allocation from the ENMU-Roswell Foundation and through two grants from the New Mexico Higher Education Department (NMHED) and Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham's Food, Farm, and Hunger Initiative. ENMU-Roswell's project, "Uplifting Food Opportunities (UFO)," received \$20,000 from the NMHED's Addressing College Hunger Initiative earlier this year. The NMHED's Addressing College Food Security grant of \$50,000 was also awarded to the campus.

Leprino Foods Donates to Campus Food Pantry

Leprino employees held a food drive to benefit the food pantry from November 1-15. Close to 300 cans of food were donated in addition to \$1000 from employees through payroll deduction.



Campus Opens New Veterans Center

NMU-Roswell opened a new Veterans Center on November 9. The center is located in room 129 of the Learning Resource Center, 58 University Blvd. Dr. Shawn Powell, ENMU-Roswell President and veteran of the U.S. Air Force and Air National Guard, has been working with a committee to establish the new center, which is funded through a legislative appropriation. The ENMU-Roswell

Foundation also provided funding. "Our intent for the new center is to better serve and support our student veterans with not only their educational needs but with other additional challenges they may encounter as they prepare for the future," said Powell.

The center will provide a centralized location for information on veteran resources and local assistance services in conjunction with NM Workforce Connection. The center includes a lounge area with large screen television, computers/printer, coffee maker, and filtered water dispenser. Students can utilize the center during open campus hours, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and from 8 a.m. to noon on Fridays.
