DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM

New Mexico education law requires that every student who graduates from a New Mexico public high school must earn at least one credit as an advanced placement, honors, dual credit, OR distance learning course. ENMU-Roswell offers a wide selection of dual credit courses as agreed upon with individual public school districts.

Dual credit courses are courses that accrue both high school and college credits. Tuition and general fees are waived by the institution of higher education. Students must pay for specific course fees associated with the class, and public school districts are required to pay for textbooks. Students receive both high school and college credit for the successfully completed course.

Advantages of dual credit courses include: (1) students who lag behind in the number of high school credits required for graduation are able to acquire needed credits at community colleges and universities; (2) students gain access to a broader number of academically rigorous courses; and (3) students accrue college credits while still in high school to get a 'jump start' on their college education. SPRING GRADUATION

All students planning to graduate in the spring 2023 semester are encouraged to apply by the Priority Deadline of October 7, 2022. All students who plan to participate in the spring 2023 commencement must submit a Graduation Application prior to the final application deadline of March 10, 2023.

The Graduation Application can be submitted online via the "Current Students" page at www.roswell.enmu.edu. Once the application is received, a degree audit will be performed to determine eligibility for graduation. Eligibility confirmation and further information regarding graduation activities will be emailed via student email.

LIMITED SIZE CLASSES

Enrollment in selected classes is limited, and ENMU-Roswell reserves the right to close enrollment in these classes when the maximum class size is reached.

OVERLOADS

All registrations with overloads (more than 18 credit hours in the spring semester) must be approved and signed by the Assistant Vice President of Student Affairs before courses can be entered. Students who register

for 12 to 18 credit hours will pay a flat rate. Any overload credit hours beginning at 19 are charged at a per credit hour rate. Tuition overload rates are listed on page 8.

- 2) CHECK COURSE RESTRICTIONS, COREQUISITES AND PREREQUISITES. It is your responsibility to check course descriptions in the catalog for corequisites or prerequisites. If you enroll in a course with restrictions or that requires corequisites or prerequisites without meeting the requirements, you will be withdrawn from that course. Withdrawal will reduce your credit hours and effect your eligibility for financial aid, scholarships, and veteran's benefits.
- 3) CLEAR HOLDS. Holds on your record will prevent you from enrolling. Holds may be from Admissions Office, academic probation, academic suspension waivers, academic suspension, address verification, Advising Office, Financial Aid Office, Business Office, degree/major restrictions, unpaid parking citations and disciplinary actions. MANDATORY CAMPUS ID CARDS

All registered ENMU-Roswell students MUST have a valid student ID card if taking classes on campus or at an off-campus site within Chaves County. Student ID cards are optional for students who are ONLY taking courses online and will NOT be using campus facilities, such as the library, computer labs, or PE Center.

The Security Office will issue FREE ID cards to all individuals (who provide a government issued photo ID) utilizing any campus facilities, including

community members who may use only the PE Center or Library. For students, you will need to provide a current invoice showing credits applied towards tuition costs and a government issued photo ID, such as a driver's license. Validation stickers will be added each semester to keep IDs current by provided a current invoice.

MANDATORY PARKING STICKERS

All students, staff, and community members must have a mandatory FREE parking sticker displayed at the bottom left of their vehicle's rear window to avoid parking citations. The Security Office issues FREE PARKING STICKERS year round, with new stickers issued at the beginning of the academic year each August. To obtain a parking sticker, the Security Department must be presented with a valid campus ID card and the vehicle registration.

VETERANS EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS

Students utilizing Veteran's Education Benefits for the spring 2023 semesters must submit the Request for Certification form along with any required documentation to the Veterans Services Coordinator, located in the Student Services Center. Registration for spring 2023 will be available beginning October 30, 2022 (online) and October 31, 2022 (in-person). Students are encouraged to register as soon as possible to ensure required program courses are available.

Please submit documentation by the priority deadlines of January 6, 2023.

NOTICE: Students may drop classes online, or at the Student Services Center during the Add/Drop period, as posted on the University Calendar. Students who withdraw after the Add/Drop period must adhere to the withdrawal policy as published in the College Catalog. Students who fail to complete the withdrawal process will owe the full amount of tuition.

LATE REGISTRATION AND DROP/ADD PERIODS

Late registration and the Drop/Add (D/A) period will be according to the session start date. All invoices are due and payable by the first day of classes, or you will be voided for non-payment. Students whose account is paid by a third party and students expecting to receive financial aid should verify that payment has been made to their student account. EdReady English and Math PLACEMENT

EdReady is an online platform that allows you to assess your readiness for English and Math courses at ENMU-Roswell. It also provides you with an individualized study path to help fill in any knowledge gaps in these important subjects. If you put in the time and effort and learn the material, you will be better prepared for college. The EdReady test is not timed, the student can take as much time as they need to complete the exam.

All entering students are required to test in each area unless they meet the exemptions. Students with ACT scores of 19 or higher in Math and 7 or higher in English are exempt from taking the EdReady test. Students with at least 30 credit hours or an associate degree are exempt from taking the EdReady test. In order to correctly place the student, the EdReady test must have been taken within the last three years. Please see program requirements for testing information. The EdReady exam can be taken at home or if you choose to take it at ENMU-R the exam is administered on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, Friday from 8 am to 10 am For more information, please contact the Testing Services staff at (575) 624-7227 or (575) 624-7183.

TESTING SERVICES INFORMATION

Testing Services is located on the second floor of the Instructional Center in Suite 208.
