**SEQUENCE:** In order to increase chances of success in more advanced courses, it is *strongly recommended* that students complete the Core 4 in the first two semesters. Choices in the General Education courses can be added to reach semester requirements. All Program required courses should be taken AFTER General Education courses have been completed.

Courses only offered once a year are identified at the end of the course title with the following designations: Fa = fall only; Sp = spring only. NOTE: Course enrollment determines whether a course will be offered each semester.

**Advisor's Notes/Recommendations:**

- In order to improve student success probability and reduce unnecessary attrition, all students must take the University Skills Placement Test prior to entering the program.
- All lectures and corresponding labs must be taken simultaneously.
- Student must have an **ENMU Campus System** cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in order to meet graduation requirements.
- Submit a Graduation Application before the close of the semester preceding the expected completion date.
