

## ENMU-Roswell Hosts Aviation STEM Expo

More than 3,500 students from middle schools, high schools and colleges throughout the state attended the New Mexico Aviation and Aerospace STEM Expo on September 26. ENMU-Roswell collaborated with New Mexico Aero Education, the Roswell Air Center, the City of Roswell, and the Roswell Independent School District to host the expo.

The focus of the event for ages 13 to 21 was Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM), while promoting general aviation and the aerospace industry in New Mexico. The theme of the expo was "Women in Aviation and Science." Students enjoyed hands-on displays and activities that featured general and military aircraft, higher education institutions, science demonstrations, flight training schools, military recruiting and aviation maintenance education. Students also talked with pilots, engineers, educators and industry partners about careers in the aviation, aerospace, and military career fields.



The expo's opening ceremony featured Jill Myers (right), an aerospace and aviation management consultant and private pilot. Myers has spent 30 years in the industry, including working with Boeing, Raytheon and Northrop Grumman. She encouraged students to "Dream Big."



Expo activities encouraged all students, especially female students, to explore STEM fields. Girls in Aviation Day was celebrated around the world on October 5.



Students attending the expo were able to interact with 73 exhibitors and 32 civilian and military aircraft.

This scholarship process will renew each semester, and every student, whether or not they are selected, has an opportunity to put their name in the hat and be a recipient of this scholarship. ## Students Honor Former Aviation Instructor

Students in the ENMU-Roswell Aviation Maintenance Technology (AMT) program recognized a former student, instructor and director of the program during a plaque dedication ceremony on September 27. The ceremony, organized by AMT graduate, Randy Hamill and his wife Pat, paid tribute to Jerry DeLosh.

DeLosh joined the faculty in the summer of 1974, having graduated from the program two years earlier. That was when the program shared the S-85 hangar with most of the other trade courses at ENMU-Roswell. The new building on the edge of the flight line was completed in 1978. Under his guidance, the program was approved by the Federal Aviation Administration and the fleet of training aircraft in the hangar expanded. DeLosh retired from the campus in 2010 and passed away in 2018.

DeLosh was the longest serving instructor for the program and he worked in the field even as he trained students to become aviation mechanics. He also served as a Designated Mechanic

Examiner (DME) for the students, including Ty Whatley, who is now an AMT instructor. "The most expensive aircraft in the hangar are here because

of his efforts," said Whatley. "The pressurized C421, the Mitsubishi Turbo prop, the C210, the Acroduster biplane (which he repaired between semesters after an accident) and the crown jewel, the Bell 204 which he also painted in between semesters. The slick program that he was part of creating and polishing was instrumental in inspiring me to become an instructor here. There are hundreds of people all over the world making good livings that had the benefit of his instruction," said Whatley.
