

Who Is Eligible?

The ENMU-Roswell Presidential Scholarship is awarded to students ranked in the top 10% of his/her graduating class with a minimum 3.5 GPA. To qualify for the Presidential Scholarship, a student must enroll as a full-time student at ENMU-Roswell and graduate with an associate degree. The student must maintain a 3.5 GPA to remain qualified.

Applicants must have a current FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) on file with ENMU-Roswell. Application packets are due by April 1 of each year with recipients notified by June 1.

Scholarship Benefits

The ENMU-Roswell Presidential Scholarship is a gap-funding program, meaning that funds are applied to tuition and fees after all state, federal, private scholarships and grants are applied. If there is a remaining balance, the ENMU-Roswell Presidential Scholarship will pay the remaining balance, so there is no cost to the student.

The Presidential Scholarship will pay up to approximately \$40,000 covering the following educational expenses:

- Tuition and fees
- Books
- Cougar meal card
- Graduation expenses
- Student employment for eligible students*
- Phi Theta Kappa honor society dues
- A laptop computer is also provided to the student, which they can keep upon completion of associate degree requirements.

*Student employment is contingent on eligibility and availability of funds.

Note: Professional Pilot Training Programs are not covered by the Presidential Scholarship.

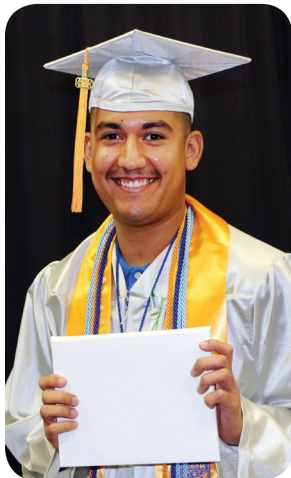
About the Program

Established in 2009, the ENMU-Roswell Presidential Scholarship is the most prestigious scholarship awarded by the campus, targeting the top performing students in our area. The competitive scholarship program is open to high school seniors in Chaves County and at Artesia High School. The Presidential Scholarship program is funded in part by the ENMU-Roswell Foundation.

More than 150 local graduates have completed degrees through the Presidential Scholarship program. These scholars are consistently named to the Dean's List each semester and are active in the Phi Theta Kappa honor society and other student organizations. Because of their success on our campus, Presidential Scholars often receive additional scholarships to transfer to four-year universities like UNM, ENMU, NMSU, Texas Tech, Texas A&M and New Mexico Tech.
